Minimum Academic Requirements:

- A Levels: A*A*A to ABB, depending on the course. A minimum of six subjects on GCSE/AS papers/A Levels. The six subjects must include a pass in English and a pass in Mathematics and a pass in a language other than English. Two of these subjects must be at grade C or above at A Level. (Note: if you are not a native English speaker, the language other than English requirement may be waived).
- IB: 30 40 points (including bonus points), depending on the course. 3 subjects at grade 5 Higher Level and 3 subjects at grade 4 Standard Level, including English, Mathematics and a language. Some courses require specific subjects such as HL Mathematics or a science or language subject. Your predictive grades are used to make Conditional offers. Full examination results are reviewed for a final decision.

 US Curriculum: Unweighted GPA 3.2-3.5/4.0 and SAT 1250 to 1400 (500 min in each session - no essay required) or ACT 27 to 32 (cumulative, without writing), depending on the course.

In the absence of standardised tests such as SAT or ACT, the Admissions Office will base admissions decisions on high school GPA and transcripts, academic references and personal statements. We will also consider additional evidence of academic merit, including Advanced Placement courses (APs), and college or honours-level classes with strong grades, where relevant to the course for which you are applying. Any standardised test scores that are submitted will be taken into consideration.

Minimum English Language Requirements

- IELTS: 5.0 overall (5.0 in writing with no element below 4.5)
- TOEFL: 64 with 16 in writing (Higher English Requirements needed for some programmes)
- Duolingo Test of English: minimum overall score of 80/160, dated since January 2020.



Minimum Academic Requirements:

2.1 degree or equivalent.



Minimum English Language Requirements:

- IELTS: Grade 6.5 overall
- TOEFL: 88 internet-based, 570 paper-based, 230 computer-based. The test taken here should be TOEFL IBT
- University of Cambridge: Proficiency Certificate, Grade C or better (CEFR Level C1 or C2)
- Advanced Certificate, Grade C or better (CEFR Level C1 or C2)
- Pearson Test of English (Academic) PTE Academic: a minimum score of 63 to be eligible (with no section score below 59)
- Duolingo English Test: minimum overall score of 110/160, dated since January 2020
- An award certificate with a minimum II.1 overall score from Trinity's Centre for English Language Learning and Teaching's Pre-Master's Pathway Programme www.tcd.ie/slscs/english/pre-sessional.
